1. No apologise were received.

Public Participation

2. 15/11254 – I didn't know about this application until it was on Marchwood Mums Facebook page tonight. I have checked online about asphalt plants and there have been concerns raised about increased headaches, nausea, asthma, skin allergies. Residents around current sites are objecting to the above health hazards. This village already has problems with higher asthma levels. Why does it have to go in Marchwood we already have enough we need to look after our health. We don't need any more health risks.

I am aware that this application says it is nearly 1000m from houses this can't be right. An extra 150 lorry movements a day 24/7. Most will be during the nights and at weekends. The noise from the lorries will become intolerable. I moved to Marchwood from Bournemouth 18 years ago and the air quality was bad then, it is just getting worse.

Marchwood is not suitable for this type of development.

Additional noise from lorries and 24/7 movements at the roundabout is not acceptable.

We need to consider the health issues for the children living in the village.

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A plant in London passed all of its inspections but there are now health issues in the area and residents are objecting to the plant remaining.

6. **RESOLVED:** To submit observations as follows:

HCC/2015/0444 & 15/11254 – Marchwood Wharf, Oceanic Way: installation and operation of an asphalt plant for a period of 5 years. **No consultation has taken place before we have received this application. Many Members are incensed about the lack of consultation and that residents have not been informed about this proposal. The application has been sneaked / rushed through. We have an incredible amount of Lorries already travelling around the village. An extra 100-150 is not acceptable especially operating at night. Put details on the Council website and Facebook page.**

It is difficult to make an informed decision as we are not aware of all of the issues associated with this application.

Object, on the following reasons: increase in traffic levels and the associated noise and emissions associated with this. The cumulative effects of the emissions being released into the atmosphere from Power Station, Inclinator, other business and now the proposed asphalt plant. The effect these emissions are having on the health of the residents of Marchwood. Potential contamination problems with water run off from the site and the water quality in the culverts. Lorry movements at night will affect the residents of Marchwood but any additional movements during the day are also unacceptable due to the current traffic volumes.

15/11036 - Pilgrim Inn, Hythe Road: external fire escape. **Support, this application will not have an impact on the street scene. The application is therefore in accordance with policy CS2 of the New**
