Dear All,

'Let's look out for each other. Drivers and cyclists are more alike than you think.'

A new road safety THINK! Campaign, supported by Hampshire County Council and Hampshire Constabulary, calls on drivers and cyclists to stay safe by looking out for each other. The campaign highlights the common ground between cyclist and driver and gives advice and tips on staying safe, visible and alert on the road.

Over the last five years 760 cyclists have been killed or seriously injured on roads in Hampshire and the Isle of Wight. The new safety campaign is based on the premise that cyclists and drivers are often one and the same, as 80% of cyclists hold a driving licence and one in five drivers cycle at least once a month. In support of this, buses across the county will display the slogan:

**LET'S
LOOK
OUT
FOR EACH OTHER**

Stuart Jarvis, Director of Environment, Transport and Economy at Hampshire County Council said:

"Although there are sometimes differences of opinion between cyclists and drivers this campaign encourages mutual respect to make Hampshire's roads safer for all, by driving or cycling responsibly."

Sergeant Darren Ord, of Hampshire Constabulary's Roads Policing Unit said: "When we talk about cycle safety with road users, we often find there's a 'them and us' attitude between drivers and cyclists, despite that fact that most of them at one time or another do both.

"The campaign is simply about mutual respect, for cyclists to make themselves as visible as possible so they have less chance of being injured and for drivers to simply keep their eyes peeled for cyclists.

"It's not about blaming any particular group for collisions on our roads, it's about everyone taking responsibility to look out for each other."

This may be of some interest to readers it originates from Newcastle but the results are quite impressive:



With its main campus based in the heart of the city, the bicycle is the preferred mode of transport for many students at Newcastle University.

On most days there are hundreds of bikes chained up outside faculty buildings and they have become a target for opportunist thieves.

However, such crime has been significantly reduced thanks to new research by the university's Centre for Behaviour and Evolution - and the solution is brilliant in its simplicity.

The research team found that by placing pictures of staring eyes above bike racks less bikes were stolen.

In a two year experiment on the university campus, the academics managed to reduce thefts from the racks with the eye pictures, combined with a short anti-theft message, by 62%.

There was also a noticeable difference in places without the signs, where bike theft went up by 63%, suggesting that the crime had been displaced to other locations, rather than eliminated.

A 2006 study found that staring eyes made people pay almost three times as much into a tea-room honesty box.

And research in 2010 showed that people using a canteen were more likely to clear away their tray after a meal when there were eyes watching them.

The crime-fighting idea is now being tried by British Transport Police, with train company C2C, on a route between London's Fenchurch Street station and Southend in Essex.



Update - unexplained dog deaths



Latest update from the New Forest District Council

24 April 2013

Following many tests and on-site investigations, it is still not known what is responsible for the recent dog deaths in the Ogdens (Fordingbridge) area of the New Forest – it could be something in the environment or it may be something not related to the Forest.

Local vets, specialist laboratories, New Forest District Council, The Forestry Commission and The Environment Agency continue to co-operate in working to find the cause of the illness but the reality is that it may never be known.

The number of cases is a small proportion of the dogs walked in the New Forest every day and the instances are not isolated to the New Forest. (There has been one confirmed case in Surrey and two in Worcestershire.) Owners are asked to be vigilant, and to contact their vet if they have any concerns about their dogs.

The Forest is open for business as usual and there is no evidence to suggest that there is any threat to human health.
