We have received several reports this week of forest gates being left open at Stoney Cross potentially allowing access by livestock to A31 main road. If you do have cause to use one of these gates please ensure that you close it behind you. It may become necessary for the gates to be locked shut if this continues and then a key would be required in order to gain access.
